Saint Mary Magdalen Apostle to the Apostles



Pope Francis recognized Saint Mary Magdalen as an apostle to the apostles. An apostle listens and learns one's meaning and purpose in life from his Master or Rabbi. Jesus chose his apostles and first disciplined them by spending time together talking, thinking, and being tender towards each other by building a trustworthy friendship. For three years, Jesus shared the Way and the Truth to Live and Love as a disciple of Jesus. After praying to the Father and observing the disciples, Jesus chose twelve men and several women to grow closer to Him.

Our patron, Mary Magdalen, developed a special relationship with Jesus, who delivered her from "seven demons" and allowed her to support him financially. On Easter Sunday, these holy women came to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus but found it empty. She did not leave but instead wept and prayed that she would discover who stole the body of Jesus. God answered her patience by being the first to encounter our Risen Lord. Then, Jesus sent Mary Magdalen to announce the marvelous good news to the apostles.

On July 22, which is the feast of Saint Mary Magdalen, we are called to discipline our lives to share and care for others with the mind and heart of our Risen Lord. Together, Jesus commands us to unite our minds and hearts with Jesus and Saint Mary Magdalen to participate in *"Building a family of faith in Jesus Christ, through Catholic worship, education, and charity."*

The Sacraments nourish and challenge us to grow in reverence, respect, and responsibility to build strong families and friendships. Like Mary Magdalen, grow in self-confidence by humbly sharing your faith and by practicing these five T'S:

TIME TOGETHER: It is the greatest gift we have to offer one another.

TALK TOGETHER: Communication is the blood that nourishes communion of mind and heart. Prayer together makes the power of the Holy Spirit come alive.

THINK TOGETHER: Have a willingness to share what is of value in your mind and heart and practice the BE-ATTITUDE OF JESUS. We become a blessing to others rather than an obstacle. We are precious children of God with a divine destiny.

TENDER TOGETHER: Because Original Sin and self-centeredness afflict all of us, Jesus invites us to repent and reconcile with God by forgiving others and our self. We admit that we can wound and heal. Wounded healers make witnesses of Jesus.

TRUST TOGETHER: We become trustworthy by being faithful and believing that we can earn the trust of others. To love and be loved is a daily decision, not just a feeling. As gifted-givers, we become apostles sharing our time, talents, and treasure.

A Forgiveness Prayer for Adults

In the following prayer, many significant areas of forgiveness are covered. This prayer may bring to mind other aspects that need forgiveness. Let the Holy Spirit move freely and guide your mind to persons or groups you need to forgive.

Lord Jesus Christ, I ask today to forgive everyone in my life. I know that You will give me strength to forgive, and I thank You that You love me more than I love myself and want my happiness more than I desire it for myself.

Lord Jesus, I want to be free from the feelings of resentment, bitterness, and unforgiveness toward You for the times I thought You sent death, hardships, financial difficulties, punishments, and sickness in our family.

Lord, I forgive myself for my sins, faults, and failings. I forgive myself for all that is truly bad in myself or all that I think is bad. For delving in the occult (*Ouija boards, horoscopes, seances, fortune telling, lucky charms or dream catchers*), for taking my name in vain, for not worshipping You, for hurting my parents, for getting drunk, for using illegal drugs, for the misuse of legal drugs, for sins against my purity, for adultery, for abortion, for stealing, for lying — today, I truly forgive myself. Thank You, Lord, for Your grace at this moment.

I truly forgive my mother. I forgive her for all the times she hurt me, resented me, was angry with me, and for all the times she punished me unjustly. I forgive her for the times she preferred my siblings to me. I forgive her for the times she told me I was dumb, ugly, stupid, the worst of her children, or that I cost our family a lot of money. For the times she told me I was unwanted, an accident, a mistake, or not what she expected. I forgive her for any negativity, gossip, manipulation, or poor example, I genuinely forgive her.

I sincerely forgive my father. I forgive him for lack of support, any lack of love, affection, or attention. I forgive him for any lack of time, for not granting his

companionship, for his excessive drinking, fighting, arguing with my mother, or myself and my siblings. For his severe punishments, desertion, being away from home, divorcing my mother, or running around, I forgive him.

(Note: Forgiveness for mother and father can be interchangeable depending on your situation.)

Lord, I extend forgiveness to my sisters and brothers. I forgive those who rejected me, lied about me, hated me, resented me, competed for my parents' love, those who hurt me, or who physically harmed me. For those who were too severe with me, punished me, or made my life unpleasant in any way, I forgive them.

Lord, I truly forgive my spouse for any lack of love, affection, consideration, support, attention, communication, faults, failings, weakness, and any other acts or words that cause hurt or disturb me.

Jesus, I forgive my children for their lack of respect, obedience, love, attention, support, warmth, understanding, bad habits, falling away from the Church, and any actions or words that disturb me.

My God, I forgive my in-laws, sons and daughters-in-law, sisters, and brothers-in-law, and other relatives by marriage. I forgive them for their lack of love, words of criticism, thoughts, actions, gossip, or omissions that injured and caused pain.

Lord, please help me forgive my relatives. I forgive my grandmothers, and grandfathers who interfered in our family, were possessive of my parents, caused me difficulty, or turned one parent against the other.

Jesus, help me to forgive my co-workers who are disagreeable or make life harder for me. For those who push their work off on me, gossip about me, would not cooperate with me, or tried to take my job, I forgive them.

I truly forgive my neighbors, Lord. For their noise, property disrepairs, not training their pets properly, not taking in their trash cans, prejudices, rudeness, and any other offensive behavior, I forgive them.

I now forgive my clergymen, my congregation, and my church for their lack of support, pettiness, poor sermons, lack of friendliness, lack of affirmation, lack of inspiration, for not using me in a critical position, for not inviting me to serve, and for any other hurt they have inflicted—I forgive them today.

Lord, I forgive all professional people who have hurt me in any way—doctors, nurses, police officers, hospital works, lawyers, contractors. For anything they did to me unjustly, I truly forgive them.

Lord, I forgive my employer for not paying me enough money, not appreciating my work, being unkind and unreasonable with me, being angry and unfriendly, not promoting me, and not complimenting me on my work.

Lord, I forgive my past and present schoolteachers, professors, and instructors. For those who punished me, humiliated me, insulted me, treated me unjustly, picked on me, considered or called me feeble-minded, or made me stay after school unjustly.

Lord, I forgive my friends for letting me down, lost contact with me, didn't support me, were unavailable when I was in need, borrowed money and did not return it, gossiped about me, or caused me unhappiness in any way. I honestly forgive them.

Lord Jesus, I especially pray for the grace of forgiveness for that one person in life who has hurt me the most. I ask to forgive anyone who I consider my greatest enemy, the one who I said I would never forgive.

Thank You, Jesus, that I am free of the evil of unforgiveness. Let Your Holy Spirit fill me with light, and let every dark area of my mind be enlightened. Amen.

Remember, forgiveness is an act of will, not a feeling. Jesus calls us to forgive always and throughout our entire lives. Each day, we need to forgive those who hurt or injure us.

"Then Peter came up and said to him, 'Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven.'" (Matt. 18:21-22) 🌺

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**Book of the Prophet Jeremiah 23:1-6,
Psalm 23:1-6, Ephesians 2:13-18,
& Mark 6:30-34**

Many people classify the Old Testament prophets. When a priest friend was assigned to a new parish, he learned that it was deeply in debt, poorly managed, and low in Mass attendance. As a result, he would simply say, "At least we have Jesus!" This is also what the scripture readings speak to us about today. That is, when everything could be better, don't fret because, "at least we have Jesus."

In the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah, we hear of God's disappointment in the shepherds of His flock. At that time, in and around Israel, kings were often called "shepherds" because they had a duty to look after their people. As monarchs, they were expected to act on behalf of God toward His people. Unfortunately, only a few kings in Israel were men of faith, and many contrary to what was expected of them, did nothing to help the faith of their people. At the end of the first reading, we hear God promising that He will raise a wise and honest king. Jesus is the One whom the Father sends as the wise and honest shepherd of His people.

In the Gospel narrative of Saint Mark, we see Jesus fulfilling the role of shepherd to the people. Our Lord took pity on them since they were "like sheep without a shepherd," so He decided to teach them. What then does "sheep without a shepherd" mean? The answer is a simple one. It means that they lacked leadership, and without it, they would wander and go astray. The people who heard Jesus knew He was different, and as a result, they hurried to where He would be. In some respect, we can see similarities between then and now because we, too, have so many distractions that make us wonder and stray from our Good shepherd. However, "at least we have Jesus."

When we truly have Jesus, we have everything, even if we have nothing else, because, as I mentioned, Jesus IS everything. We are living in a world that has become, in a word—chaotic. With all of the distractions we face, I recommend that we cherish

the immortal words of Fr. Ray Fecteau from Our Lady of the Visitation Parish in Darnestown, Maryland, as he reminds us, "At least we have Jesus!"

Question of the Day: Will you follow the Holy Words of Jesus as He shepherds you to everlasting life?

Prayer: "My sheep hear my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me."


