## Do You Share Jesus Heart To Heart?



*Our parish staff wishes you a healthy, happy, & holy summer!*

**What kind of authority and power does the Lord want you to exercise on His behalf?** Jesus gave His apostles both the power and the authority to speak and to act in His name. He commanded them to do the works which he did including healing the sick. They were to cast out evil spirits and speak God's word—the Good News of the Gospel, which they received from Jesus.

**When Jesus spoke of power and authority, He did something unheard of—He wedded power and authority with self-sacrificing love and humility.** The "world" and the "flesh" seek power for selfish gain. Jesus teaches us to use it for the good of our neighbors. Why does Jesus tell the apostles to "travel light" with little or no provision? "Poverty of spirit" frees us from greed and preoccupation with our possessions and makes ample room for God's provision. The Lord wants His disciples to be dependent on Him and not on themselves. He wills to work in and through each of us for His glory.

**Before arriving at St. Mary Magdalen, Fr. Jonathan experienced the mission of the twelve disciples in a profound and radical way.** In July of 2020, right after three months of lockdown due to COVID, around 2,000 youth, couples, seminarians, and priests from all over the United States, spent an entire week living this Gospel. Divided into groups of two or three, they were given a city or town to visit, and they were equipped with nothing but a rosary, Bible, prayer book, and the clothes on their back. During that week, Fr. Jonathan and his two companions, trusting in God's providential hand, depended on Him and saw that they had the authority to bring peace and hope to those most affected by the pandemic.

**The Lord invites each of us, in our small way, to do the same.** Are you ready to use the spiritual authority and power which God wishes you to exercise on His behalf? The Lord entrusts us with His gifts and talents. Are you eager to place yourself at His service, to do whatever He bids you, and to witness His truth and saving power to whomever He sends you?

**Prayer:** "Lord Jesus, make me a channel of your healing power and merciful love that others may find abundant life and freedom in you. Free me from all other attachments that I may joyfully pursue the treasure of your heavenly kingdom. May I witness the joy of the Gospel both in word and deed."

**Act of Contrition:** O my God, I am sorry for my sins because I have offended you. Help me to be more like you, Jesus, in thought, word, and deed. Holy Spirit, give me your grace and guidance each day. Amen.

*If you have discovered this simple prayer (above), you know it holds a beautiful invitation to a life fully surrendered to Jesus and his healing work in the soul. If you haven't, this new litany based on the message of mercy just may give you a sense of peace even now when the tides of uncertainty and unrest are swirling uncomfortably high. God always gives us what we need when we need it, which Sr. Faustina, a Sister of Life and the author of the prayer, is the first to admit.*

### **How did the 'Litany of Trust' come to be?**

"When I went to prayer, I saw Jesus in the Gospels and he was asking, 'Do you believe me? Do you trust me, that I am the Lord?' I kept grappling with what trust was and why it was important. He kept showing

me how crucial it was to trust him" says Sr. Faustina. She continues, "Jesus gently seemed to lift my chin to make me look at him, and in an instant, there was a grace. He seemed to say, 'I don't want your 'yes' to go to a bunch of circumstances. I want you to give it to me. I don't want your trust to be in the safe realm of your understanding, but in me.' At that moment, I realized that this is love, and it moved my heart so deeply. That Jesus was pursuing my love, this pure gift I had to give him...I think deep down, I did know it was for others, but it felt so vulnerable to share that I kept it to myself for about a year. I prayed it myself. And although I had a sense it would be for others, I didn't know it would be for this many others!" (*Excerpts from the National Catholic Register blog from 8/20*)

## FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



**Book of the Prophet Amos 7:12-15,  
Psalm 85:9-10, 11-12, 13-14, Ephesians 1:3-14,  
& Mark: 6:7-13**

Many people classify the Old Testament prophets  
When you think about it, there is always someone  
who can help us in various ways when we need help.  
When we are ill, we call a doctor; when our car  
needs repair, we call a mechanic; and so forth.  
God has provided us with those who can help  
us when we need spiritual help.

Fortunately for us, God calls our fellow  
individuals to minister to our spiritual needs.

For example, God called prophets like Amos in  
our first reading to preach His Word. In the Gospel  
narrative of Saint Mark, Jesus sends out the twelve  
apostles to preach and to heal. The apostles would  
be ordained the first priests during the Last Supper.  
Today and every day, God calls individuals to  
become priests, deacons, and members of  
religious communities. The need is great!

Why does God do this? It's simple. He calls on fellow  
humankind to minister on His behalf because He  
takes humanity seriously, perhaps more seriously  
than we do, which is another reason why God calls  
our fellow humans to minister to us on His behalf.

In today's Gospel account, our Lord sends His  
disciples out to 'test their wings' as missionaries. The  
word mission comes from the Latin word 'mittere'  
meaning 'send.' The disciple's calling is to do good  
things with specific instructions on how to do it,  
including traveling. Essentially, they are to test more  
than their wings by understanding God's care and  
fidelity to them as they go forth on their mission.

Jesus tells them to expect rejection or at least not be  
accepted, just because He sent them to perform their  
mission for folks who need their help. If and when  
rejection comes, they were to "shake the dust off their  
feet in testimony against them" and continue their  
mission, not feeling discouraged or disrespected.

We are each called by God to be missionaries,  
proclaimers, and witnesses to others of His Holy

Words. It doesn't matter what your profession is or if  
you are young or old. Our mission is to preach, heal,  
teach and become witness to the Good News of  
Jesus. In short, we are to evangelize! Unfortunately,  
many still have the idea that the call of Christ is  
directed only to apostles and their successors—  
the bishops, priests, deacons, and the religious  
orders, which is not true. Every Catholic Christian is  
commissioned to a ministry of love and justice by  
virtue of their baptism and confirmation.

The Lord Jesus entrusts each of us with various gifts  
and talents. We must not turn our backs on Him,  
and we should eagerly place ourselves at His service.  
We must do whatever He bids of us.

**Question of the Day:** How will you become  
a witness of God's truth and saving power to  
whomever He sends to you?

**Prayer:** May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ  
enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may know  
what is the hope that belongs to our call.



### NEW! SMM CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

Facilities updates and enhancements are in full swing this summer! Investing in the future of our parish and school, we will spend approximately \$350,000 on these improvements. To ensure a high-quality experience, we upgraded the Livestream capabilities, added new cameras, and upgraded the church sound system. We addressed structural concerns in the cupulas and bell tower by replacing the windows, patching and painting, and replacing the lighting fixtures with efficient LED lights. We continue our restorations in the school, ensuring enhanced security with a new fire alarm system and emergency lighting. We have also upgraded the flooring, replaced or repaired windows, and replaced crumbling sewer piping. We are replacing a large portion of the rooftop ventilation system to ensure clean air movement.
