THE SUNDAY REFLECTION

Book of Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b Psalm 34:2-3, 16-17, 18-19, 20-21 Ephesians 5:21-32, & John 6:60-69

In today's Gospel narrative, Jesus had finished His saying many things hard for even His disciples to hear. They listened to him telling them about eating His flesh and being the "Bread of Life," and some have decided to leave Him. We see Him turn to His closest friends and ask whether they will leave as well. Peter, speaking for all of them, as well as for all of us, replies, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." As we know, eventually, they will also leave to find more innoxious places to go temporarily.

If not understood, Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians might cause wives and husbands to leave Jesus or even each other. There are firm and disorienting words, like 'subordinate,' and the husband is the 'head of his wife,' when taken out of context and reacted to, creating doubt in Jesus and turning away from Him a proper response. Or is it?

The disciples considered their decision to return to their families rather than following Jesus.

The steps they used in arriving at their decision were based to the issue at hand. They thought out the problem, were decisive and stuck to their decision, and were faithful to the decision. We can assume that those who chose a life not in Jesus are true to their decision. Why did some no longer walk with Jesus? Similarly, why do some family members arrive at different ways of responding to the existence of God and the person of Jesus? I am sorry to say that I don't have an answer to those questions.

I've decided, after reviewing the 'evidence', that Jesus continues to embrace us all, both those who walk His Way and those who walk another way. However, Jesus ALWAYS remains faithful to all of us. With Him, it is not yes or no-just YES. As humans, we become aware of new things and think them over to see if we need to make a new choice. Our faith response is not written in stone but in our hearts of flesh, so we react accordingly.

To follow Jesus is not to be afraid of asking or being asked tough questions. I believe that we can move more devotedly in the life of Christ by just re-reading our Baptismal promise and acknowledging that He claims us through water and fire on that day and each day that follows.

Question of the Day: How will you allow yourself to follow Jesus, who is the Way, the truth, and the life?

Prayer: Your words, Lord, are Spirit and life; you have the words of everlasting life.

SMM CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

Facilities updates and enhancements are in full swing this summer! Investing in the future of our parish and school, we will spend approximately \$350,000 on these improvements. To ensure a high-quality experience, we upgraded the Livestream capabilities, added new cameras, and upgraded the church sound system. We addressed structural concerns in the cupulas and bell tower by replacing the windows, patching and painting, and replacing the lighting fixtures with efficient LED lights. We continue our restorations in the school, ensuring enhanced security with a new fire alarm system and emergency lighting. We have also upgraded the flooring, replaced or repaired windows, and replaced crumbling sewer piping. We are replacing a large portion of the rooftop ventilation system to ensure clean air movement. We are blessed to be able to improve our church and school for the benefit of everyone. We are grateful for your continued support of our spiritual home.
